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1. About the School

About the schools:- The school is situated on link road connecting NH 64 and SH 12A in the jurisdiction of village-Jhaneri which is at about 6 KMs from Bhawanigarh. The school started on 04 April 2011. The primary occupation of the local inhabitants is farming. Although the local community already has the access to free and compulsory education, but free and quality education in a CBSE English medium school was a distant dream for them. After the emergence of few Satya Bharti Schools up to primary level, the need of benefit of continual education arose and finally the senior school project was laid down. The offerings of the Bharti Foundation are a boon to the local residents. A well maintained, process driven and huge CBSE affiliated English medium school with all basic amenities of education slowly and steadily became the Centre of attraction for all. The flow of the school in the society in the form of holistically developed students made the project highly successful in its cause. The school now serves more than 1091 students from 28 surrounding villages including seven Satya Bharti Schools. The school is a proud owner of the oldest students of Bharti Foundation steering themselves into a wholesome futuristic personalities

The school now serves around 1091 students from 48 surrounding villages, including four Satya Bharti schools, out of which 51.42 % are girls and 75.52% belong to the SC/ST/OBC category. The majority of the families of students enrolled in the school are marginal farmers, daily wage laborers, and petty traders, and they are first-generation learners.

1.1 School as a space of expression, creativity, and joyful learning

The school provides bright, airy, and comfortable spaces along with adequate facilities of electricity, water, a sports field, and separate toilets for girls and boys. The classrooms are designed to facilitate group sitting arrangements and aid learning practices followed in the schools. The motive of these schools is not only to educate the young but also to help them realize their potential by learning from peer members and learning life skills such as interpersonal relationships, adaptability, self-awareness, collaboration, critical thinking, problem-solving, creative thinking, learning from failure, decision-making, managing emotions, empathy, etc.



1.2 Curriculum aligned with National Curriculum Framework (NCF -2005)

Satya Bharti schools follow best practices from curricular structures followed in schools across the country and are, in essence, a child-centric, holistic, pragmatic, value-based academic program. The curriculum is based on NCF -2005 guidelines; hence, it is in consonance with CBSE and all other state board guidelines. Lesson plans are created by teachers to maximize the engagement of students of all levels and provide them with opportunities for experiential learning. Teachers use various sorts of methods and activities to make all the children active and responsive during learning. As part of the New Education Policy 2020, Satya Bharti Schools has started taking new initiatives to cope with the new demands.

1.3 Innovative Teaching Learning Material (TLM): The school uses a

variety of TLMs to aid the teaching-learning process. Teachers are encouraged and rewarded to innovate different TLMs for different levels of students. Use of Jodo Gayan, mathematics park teaching aids for mathematics, and interactive TLM like IBB (interactive bulletin boards), self-correcting cards, and executing practicals in the labs under the guidance of expert teachers Satya Bharti Schools has established Robotics Labs with the collaboration of Stemrobo Tech Pvt. Ltd., Noida, UP, to excel in the sphere of technology and science, where students of different grades create various innovative things and equipment. An initiative

4. Of the total 95 students (who passed):
 - (a) 28 students 29.47% % are in (>80% marks) (LY 28.8%).
 - (b) 5 students (5.2%) scored above 90% (LY 3.8%).
 - (c) 9 students (9.4%) less than 60% (LY 9.6%).
 - (d) **Subject Highest Marks:** English (97), History (94), Retail (99), B. Studies (95), Pol Science (99), B&W (100), Accounts (90), Punjabi (100), Economics (80), and Physical Education (92)
 - (e) **Highest marks 479 out of 500 (95.8%).**

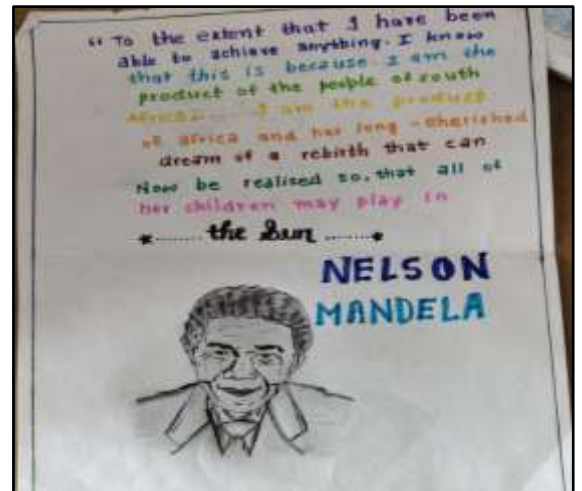

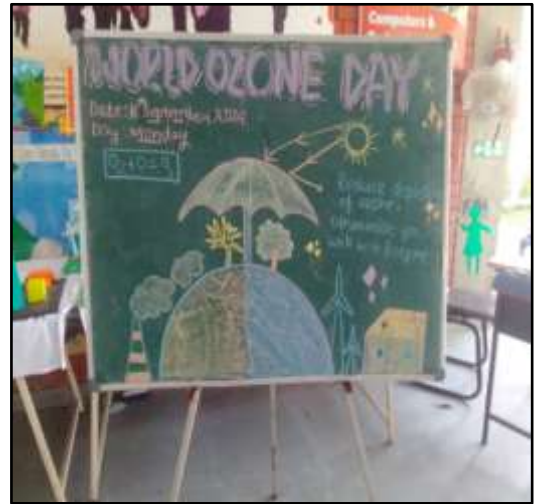
10. **Zero Discrimination Day**

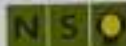
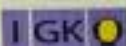

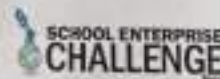
